Introductory Summary

The Turks and Caicos Islands Human Rights Commission invites high school students to participate in the Voices for Rights Graphic Design & Theme Competition.

This year's Human Rights Day celebrations will focus on two urgent human

1. Reforming the Remand System: Protecting Human Rights and Restoring Confidence in Justice – Prolonged detention without trial undermines dignity, disrupts families, and weakens trust in justice.

2. Gun Violence and Human Rights: Building Safer Communities in the **Turks and Caicos Islands** – Gun violence threatens the right to life, safety, and freedom from fear, while also placing pressure on communities to provide stronger youth opportunities, mental health support, and collective resilience.

Participants must create one original graphic design and a matching theme or slogan that together highlight these issues under a single, unifying human rights message.

The winning design & theme pair will serve as the official graphic for the Voices for Rights dialogue and will also be used on the Human Rights Day T-shirts worn during the Walk for a Cause.

Eligibility

- Open to high school students in the Turks and Caicos Islands.
- Submissions must be original, self-created, not Al-generated, and not plagiarized.
- Only one entry per participant.

Competition Guidelines

- The design must highlight the spirit of International Human Rights Day and reflect the principles of human rights.
- The graphic design and theme must be clearly connected and work together as a single message.
- The design should be bold, simple, and suitable for printing on T-shirts.
- Entries may be digital artwork or hand-drawn designs (scanned or clearly photographed).

Each entry must include:

- A graphic design (that can be used on the official T-shirt).
- A matching theme/slogan that unifies remand reform and gun violence under one human rights message.
